2026 Autumn Night Competitions

Waverley Night Netball Association Inc. invites teams and clubs to compete in the **2026 Autumn Night Competitions**.

New in 2026: Mixed 13 & Under Competition

This exciting addition provides a fantastic opportunity for young players to experience netball in a fun and inclusive environment. All players must be 13 & Under as at 31st December 2026 for the Mixed 13& Under Competition.

When entering the competition, all teams agree to abide by the Rules of the Association. A full copy of the rules is published in the fixture book, available on the website, and can also be requested from the Association.

Key Dates & Deadlines - 2026 Autumn Season

- Entries Open: 13th October 2025.
- Entries Close: Friday, 28 November 2025
- Season Commences: Week of 29 January 2026
- Grand Finals: Monday 22 Thursday 25 June 2026
- AGM & Fixture release: Wednesday 21 January, 2026

Please ensure all entries are submitted by the closing date. Late entries may not be accepted.

COMPETITIONS AVAILABLE:

MONDAY

Mixed 13 & Under Competition:

- Matches will consist of 4 x 10-minute quarters with no injury time allowed.
- The earliest games start at 5.20 pm and are played on the indoor courts and outdoor courts if required.
- Umpires: The first-named team must supply an umpire
- Entry Fee: \$90.00 per team
 Court Fee \$65.00 per team per game

Female Open Age Indoor Competition:

- Matches will consist of 4 x 10-minute quarters, with no injury time allowed. The earliest games start at 6.45 pm, the latest games start at 9.15 pm
- Umpires: First-named team must supply an umpire or apply for an umpire to the association
 Entry Fee: \$90.00 per team
 Court Fee \$70.00 per team per game

TUESDAY

Female Premier League Open Age Competition:

- Matches will consist of 4 x 15-minute quarters with no injury time allowed
- Earliest games start at 6.15 pm, latest games start at 9:45 pm
- Umpires: Supplied by the competition
- Entry Fee: \$90.00 per team Court Fee **\$100.00** per team per game

WEDNESDAY

Female Premier League 17 & Under Competition:

- Matches will consist of 4 x 15-minute quarters with no injury time allowed.
- All matches are played at 5.50 pm and/or 7.00 pm. Section 1 plays indoors, while Sections 2-5 play on the outdoor courts.
- Umpires: Supplied by the competition
- Entry Fee: \$90.00 per team Indoor Court Fee **\$100.00** per team per game

Outdoor Court Fee - \$80.00 per team per game

Female Open Age Indoor Competition:

- Matches will consist of 4 x 15-minute quarters with no injury time allowed.
- The earliest games start at 7.00 pm, the latest games start at 9.15 pm
- Umpires: The first-named team must supply an umpire or apply for an umpire to the association
- Entry Fee: \$90.00 per team Court Fee \$70.00 per team per game

THURSDAY

Female 13 & Under Competition:

(Males under 13 years of age as at the first day of competition (29/01/2026) may participate)

- Matches will consist of 4 x 10-minute quarters with no injury time allowed. Matches will be at 5.00 pm, 5.50 pm or 6:40 pm
- Umpires: The first-named team must supply an umpire or apply for an umpire to the association
- Entry Fee: \$90.00 per team
 Court Fee \$65.00 per team per game

Female 15 & Under Competition:

(Males less than 13 years of age as at the first day of competition (29/01/2026) may participate)

- Matches will consist of 4 x 10-minute quarters with no injury time allowed. Matches will be at 6.40 pm, 7.30 pm, 8.20 pm or 9.10 pm
- Umpires: The first-named team must supply an umpire or apply for an umpire to the association
- Entry Fee: \$90.00 per team
 Court Fee \$65.00 per team per game

Match times are a guide only; it will depend on the number of teams entered in the competition.

*Nationally the Woolworths NetSetGO program will undergo a rebrand and refresh ahead of the 2025 season, with a refreshed NET Tier & new Participant Pack. As a result of these changes, Netball Victoria will open registrations for the NetSetGO Membership on 1 December 2024, to align with other Member Organisations & Netball Australia.

PHOTO CONSENT POLICY:

Photography and video footage will only be permitted by WNNA and its teams or clubs for three purposes:

- 1. Player/Umpire training and development
- 2. Association/Club promotion and publicity
- 3. For personal use by the Participant and/or family only

As outlined in Netball Victoria's Child Safety in Netball Policy, 'It is a serious breach of this Child Protection Commitment Statement and possibly the law, if any Persons in Positions of Responsibility and Authority, whether participating in a program, event, service or activity, or working in a paid or volunteer capacity, harm or exploit Children and Young People who are involved in any of NV's activities, services, events or programs. Breaches of this include, but are not limited to, any Persons in Positions of Responsibility and Authority who:

- take, reproduce and/or distribute photos of Children and Young People without their consent or the consent of their guardians
- publish any material containing images of Children and Young People...'

Association Photographer

From time-to-time, WNNA will engage a photographer/videographer to take footage for the *purpose of selling images* to participants or interested persons. Prior consent from teams or individuals, including umpires will be obtained for this purpose. Any non-consent will be clearly articulated to the engaged photographer/videographer so that images of non-consenting Teams or individuals are not obtained nor made available for purchase.

Outdoor Venues

The Waverley Netball Centre is a public open space. Neither Netball Victoria nor an Association can stop anyone from taking photographs or video images in this instance. Someone unknown to the Association who arrives at the venue and starts filming can be asked for what purpose they are filming. If the answer is satisfactory, they can be requested, but not forced, to register as per the recommended guidelines below. If the answer is not satisfactory and the person continues to behave in a 'suspicious' manner, then the Police may be called.

Indoor Venues

Indoor venues such as Waverley Netball Centre may have particular photography/video restrictions or guidelines in place which must be followed. WNC asks photographers being engaged by club/teams to register at reception prior.

Condition Of Entry

The WNNA may wish to record images of participants during WNNA competitions for promotional and training/development purposes. These images may be used in mediums including publications and promotional material, and broadcast, print and electronic media.

WNNA agrees not to use any photo in a manner that may be deemed adverse or defamatory to the person(s) involved and it will not use the photo for any commercial gain. The photos will remain the property of the WNNA and any personal details regarding this photo will be kept confidential and will not be used for any purpose other than related to this photo.

During this competition parents and family of players may wish to record images of their family members participating for personal use only. Where possible such requests will be authorised and subject to certain conditions, noting that on public land this is not enforceable.

It is a condition of entry into the WNNA competition that participants may be subject to photography/filming as described above and that consent is provided for this purpose**.

As the Club / Team Contact entering the team into the competition, you advise that all team members and parents/guardians (if under 18) are aware of the above conditions and agree to comply.

** Under exceptional circumstances, an exemption may be granted – the team/individual needs to state, in writing, the reason an exemption is being sought to the Centre Manager.

Fixtures

- Available online via the Waverley Netball website or the Netball Connect app.
- Please read fixtures alongside the website information, Association Rules, and Regulations.

Uniforms

- Clubs/Teams must nominate their playing uniform on Entry; approval is required.
- Players must wear the approved uniform throughout the season.
- Regulation playing bibs must be worn. Sponsorship on bibs is reserved for competition sponsors unless prior approval is granted.

Walkovers

- If a team forfeits before the game clock starts, the non-offending team is awarded the match (4 points; score recorded as 10–0, or 15–0 in Premier).
- A maximum of 12 nominated players of the non-offending team will be credited a game.
- Offending team players will not be credited a game.
- Forfeit fines apply and must be paid before the next scheduled match.
- Failure to notify the office of a walkover incurs an additional 4-point penalty.

Clearances

- Required only if a player wishes to transfer to another team on the same night, in the same competition, during the season.
- No clearances will be granted after Round 10.
- Players not on the original entry form who wish to drop more than two Grades/Sections must apply in writing to the Management Committee.

Finals Eligibility

- Players must have played in at least 3 games with their team to qualify for finals.
- For Premier League competitions, players must have played at least 5 games with their team to qualify.

Kiosk

- Operated by Waverley Night Netball Association Inc.
- Offers light meals, barista coffee, cold drinks, and snacks.
- Proceeds support the Association.

Umpires

- All teams (except Premier League) must supply an umpire.
- Team umpires must hold a badge or, at minimum, have completed:
 - Foundation (formerly Level 1) Umpires Course, and
 - Rules of Netball Exam.
- Umpires rostered at the bottom of fixtures or by office approximately half the games per season.
- Junior teams (13/U, 15/U, 17/U) may be rostered to umpire at the same time as their match.
- Open Indoor team umpires will umpire before or after their game.
- The Association can supply an umpire if needed (\$30.00 per game).
- The Association supplies a **Panel Umpire** for every match.
- All Team Umpires must complete a registration sheet on their first match.

- Failure to provide an umpire as rostered may result in a **4-point loss** and a **\$50 fine**.
- Premier League: WNNA aims to supply two badged umpires to each Open Age and 17/U Premier League match.

First Aid

- Available every competition night.
- First Aid room located down the passageway from reception (opposite display cabinet).
- Assistance can also be sought at reception if a dedicated volunteer is not present.
